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I. Introduction

The College Advisor's Handbook is designed to assist college and program advisors in understanding the function of the tests that comprise the Pre-enrollment Evaluation Placement (PEP) Testing Program.

The major purpose of this Handbook is to provide information that enables you to (1) advise new incoming UIC students as to their strengths and weaknesses, and (2) allows you to create a program of study which includes the correct match of their abilities and the appropriate academic courses.

The overall goal of the PEP Testing Program continues to be to increase retention of new UIC students. By evaluating the students' abilities and then providing academic course placements that will most closely match their skills and thereby increase the probability that our students will succeed in their college courses.

The next section of the Handbook describes the PEP Testing Program for 2026 and briefly reviews the PEP tests.

II. The 2026 **PEP** Testing Program

A. General Information

The **Pre-enrollment Evaluation Placement (PEP) Testing** program consists of a series of placement tests administered to accepted UIC students prior to their enrollment in courses. The tests required for most students are **Academic Writing, Mathematics, and Foreign Language**. In addition, students in certain colleges and majors may be required to take a placement test in **Chemistry/Physics**. **Computer Science** is an optional test based on previous coursework and is limited to certain majors. The PEP program includes the administration of placement tests in 12 languages, including the Korean and Chinese languages placement examinations. Other languages not offered by the PEP Testing program may be offered by the New York University (NYU) Language Proficiency Program at the recommendation of a UIC advisor. The cost of the NYU exam varies and must be paid directly to NYU.

B. Participation in PEP Testing

Who participates in the PEP Testing program?

Most beginning UIC Freshmen are required to take the basic (Academic Writing) test, prior to enrollment in first-semester courses. However, new students are not required to take the Academic Writing placement test if UIC has an official score for one of the following:

- ACT English score of 27 or higher; OR
- SAT Evidence-Based Reading + Writing score of 630 or higher; OR
- AP English Language & Composition with a score of 3-5; OR
- IB English Language A: Language and Literature Higher or Standard Level with a score of 6-7

Note: There are no exemptions for any other tests based on SAT/ACT/IB/AP scores. A new process has been put in place to handle test scores not posted, UIC dual credit and college credit in English. A preliminary test has been added that will ask student questions. Based on the answers, the student needs to take the test or instructions are provided about what needs to be submitted. A placement code of “07” will be in Banner. Details are provided later in this document.

UIC First Year students are required to take the Math Placement Exam (ALEKS PPL).

There are no exemptions given for dual or college credit for First Year students except for English. Therefore, they must take all the other required Placement Tests (Math, and Chemistry (if required)) to sign up for orientation and advising sessions. College or test-based credit will be evaluated by advisors at an advising session.

Some colleges and majors require Chemistry, Physics and/or Foreign Language tests as well. New UIC transfer students and re-admitted UIC students are required to participate in the PEP program to the extent that they have not earned college credit for the course in which they are being tested. What is the process for taking the Placement Tests?

Newly admitted students may answer a series of questions and will be provided with links to the required exams. First year students are required to take certain exams prior to signing up for Orientation and Advising Sessions. See Section VI for screenshots outlining the process.

Please encourage all students to take the tests as early as possible.

C. Placement Test Availability

The placement test cycle begins at the end of October through the tenth day of Fall. The timeline below shows when tests are available for incoming and continuing students.

End of October through Sunday after tenth day of the spring term – Spring incoming and continuing students. An email will be sent to the Student Services Advisory Committee when the testing system is live.

Sunday after tenth day of spring term – The system is down to set up for Fall incoming students. Students can no longer take placement tests after 3:00 PM. System access is blocked. Students can complete whatever tests they are taking so long as they don't log out of the system.

Fourth week of spring term around February 1 – System is available for fall incoming and continuing students.

Friday first week of fall term - The **mathematics placement exam** closes at **5:00 PM on the first Friday** of the fall and spring terms. Students can no longer take or retake the test after that time. Extreme cases should be referred to the math department (dus-mscs@uic.edu).

Sunday after the tenth day of the fall term – Students can no longer take placement tests **after 3:00 PM**. System access is blocked. Students can complete whatever tests they are taking so long as they don't log out of the system. System is down until the end of October.

Last day to complete placement tests and register: Students can take placement tests up to the deadline dates posted above. However, the last day to take an exam that will guarantee a placement test result to be able to register for classes is:

1. Chemistry, Physics, French, German, Italian, Latin, and Russian

3:00 PM Wednesday second week of classes

2. Arabic, Chinese, Computer Science, English, Korean, Japanese, Polish, and Spanish

3:00 PM Sunday second week of classes

D. Re-testing

Test results are valid for a period of one year. Students may be able to retake after one year, depending upon the departmental requirements. Students can request to retake the Chemistry exam in less than one year, though they must wait to make their request until after they have earned a midterm grade of at least C in MATH 110. Students with a final grade of “C” or better in MATH 110 may also request a retake or may request an override from the chemistry department into CHEM 101.

Spanish 113 or 114 test scores never expire. Students are not allowed to retake the test. Spanish 101-104 test scores expire in one year.

Students can take the ALEKS PPL (Math) test five times. However, once they achieve a calculus placement (40) the test is no longer available. They must complete five hours of the ALEKS PPL learning module and wait 48 hours each time before retaking the test. There is no charge for the learning module or the retakes. ALEKS PPL retakes are allowed through 5:00 pm Friday the first week of class for the fall and spring terms. Once a student earns credit in a math course at UIC, they cannot retake the exam.

E. Accessing Test Results

Newly admitted and continuing UIC students can access placement test results on-line, via the UIC Web portal. Test results are typically available within 24-72 hours of testing. All exams that have a writing component (Academic Writing, Computer Science, Spanish, Japanese, Chinese, Korean, and Polish) will have an initial placement of “Being Reviewed”. The final placement will be posted once the written components are evaluated. Incoming Students can access their test results in the Placement Testing portlet in UIC Connect. Continuing and incoming students can access test results for all subjects by following these steps:

- 1. Continuing Students:**

- a. Log on to **MY.UIC.EDU -> Student -> Placement Test - Results**

- 2. New Incoming Students**

- a. Log on to **MY.UIC.EDU -> UIC Connect-> Determine and Complete Placement Testing -> View Available Test Results**

F. Expiration of Test Results

The tests used in the Pre-enrollment Evaluation Program are designed to place students into first year courses. Several UIC departments require students to enroll in the course listed on the Educational Performance Profile (EPP) within the first year.

Test results are valid for a period of one year. Students must either register for courses in these departments during their first year at UIC, or re-take the placement test the semester before they intend to take an initial course in that department. Students placed into Spanish 113 and 114 do not need to retake the Spanish test since the placement does not expire. Spanish scores for 113 and 114 for the last five years are displayed in the portal.

Students beginning at UIC must take the required course in these departments in the listed terms based on the start term of:

Fall 2025: Fall 2025, Spring 2026, Summer 2026

Fall 2026: Fall 2026, Spring 2027, or Summer 2027

G. Description of the 2026 PEP Tests

1. Academic Writing

This test is expected to take 2 – 4 hours to complete. After 4 hours, the test will close, and no further updates can be made. The essay test includes four steps and includes a suggestion to spend approximately 30 to 60 minutes on each step (1) reading, (2) planning, (3) writing, and approximately 10-20 minutes on step (4) proofreading. Those are only suggestions and there are no minimum times for each step. A brief survey follows the test, which is expected to take about 5-10 minutes to complete.

2. Chemistry

The Chemistry test is a 60-item multiple-choice test, timed at 60 minutes, which assesses the student's quantitative knowledge and knowledge of basic chemical concepts including nomenclature, stoichiometry, determination of limiting reactant, determination of empirical formula and use of the Periodic Table.

3. Foreign Languages

Arabic - This is an 80-item multiple-choice test, timed at 60 minutes. The test covers vocabulary, grammar, syntax, appropriate usage and reading comprehension.

Chinese – This is a two-part evaluation timed at 120 minutes. The first part is a 60 item multiple-choice section questions testing students' knowledge of Chinese vocabulary, characters, structure, cultural expressions, and reading comprehension. The second part is writing.

French - This is an 80-item multiple-choice test, timed at 60 minutes. The test covers grammar, syntax, and reading comprehension.

German -This is a 100-item multiple-choice test, timed at 60 minutes. The test covers vocabulary, grammar, and reading comprehension.

Italian - This is a 50-item multiple-choice test, timed at 60 minutes. The test covers vocabulary, syntax, grammar, and reading comprehension.

Japanese – This is a 88-item multiple choice and fill-in-the blank test, timed at 150 minutes. The test covers vocabulary, grammar, syntax, parts of speech, and appropriate usage.

Korean – This is a 125-item multiple-choice and fill-in-the-blank test, timed at 120 minutes. The test covers vocabulary, grammar, syntax, parts of speech, and appropriate usage.

Latin - This is a 73-item, multiple-choice test, timed at 60 minutes. The test includes questions on Latin reading, vocabulary, and grammar.

Polish – This is a 136-item multiple-choice test, and one essay timed at 105 minutes. The material covered in the test includes translations, vocabulary, syntax, and grammar.

Russian – This is an 86-item multiple-choice test, and one essay timed at 105 minutes. The test covers material found in the first four Russian courses, and assesses reading ability, vocabulary, and structure.

Spanish – There is only one Spanish Placement Test, which is an adaptive comprehensive exam. The total number of questions depends upon the number of correct answers in a section. The length of the assessment ranges from 45-87 questions. The test covers vocabulary, grammar, syntax, parts of speech, appropriate usage, and an essay question. The students have 120 minutes to complete 35-69 multiple choice items, 0-1 essay, and 10-18 survey items.

4. Mathematics

The mathematics test is 25-30 questions and takes between 1.5 and 2 hours to complete. The test is a computer adaptive test. Therefore, the number of questions depends upon how the student answered the previous question.

5. Physics

The Physics test is 10 questions and will take up to 60 minutes to complete. The test consists of quantitative problem-solving skills as assessed by word problems requiring logic, algebra, and trigonometry.

6. Computer Science Proficiency Test

The Computer Science Proficiency test is 7 questions and timed at 120 mins to complete. The proficiency test for CS 111 covers basic programming knowledge: sequence, selection, repetition, arrays, and basic algorithms (min, max, sum, average, and search). The test requires the reading and writing of computer code in a modern programming language (typically C, C++, C#, Java, or Python); the test is closed book and internet use as an aid is prohibited. Passing the proficiency test will give you credit for CS 111. This test is restricted to College of Engineering Computer Science and CS and Linguistics majors.

III. The 2026 Educational Performance Profile (EPP)

A. Overview

After a student has completed PEP testing, placement test results are combined with data from the student's admission application record to produce an **Educational Performance Profile (EPP)**, showing on a single form all course placements in the four subject areas covered by the PEP program. A sample EPP form will be presented as the last page of this Handbook.

Advisors access EPPs through an on-line interface provided by the UIC Office of Student Systems Services (OSSS). Advisors and other staff who participate in new student advising and orientation must provide their names and Net-IDs to OSSS so that appropriate access permissions can be set.

Student profiles can be searched individually by college, special program membership, Orientation date, or testing date. Profiles can be viewed on-line at my.uic.edu from any location and can be printed out for situations where on-line access is not practical.

The EPP includes information about ACT, SAT, AP and IB tests used to exempt students from the English Placement Test. Official scores must be in Banner for this exemption to appear.

The following pages describe the process of accessing student profiles via the Placement Testing Main Menu.

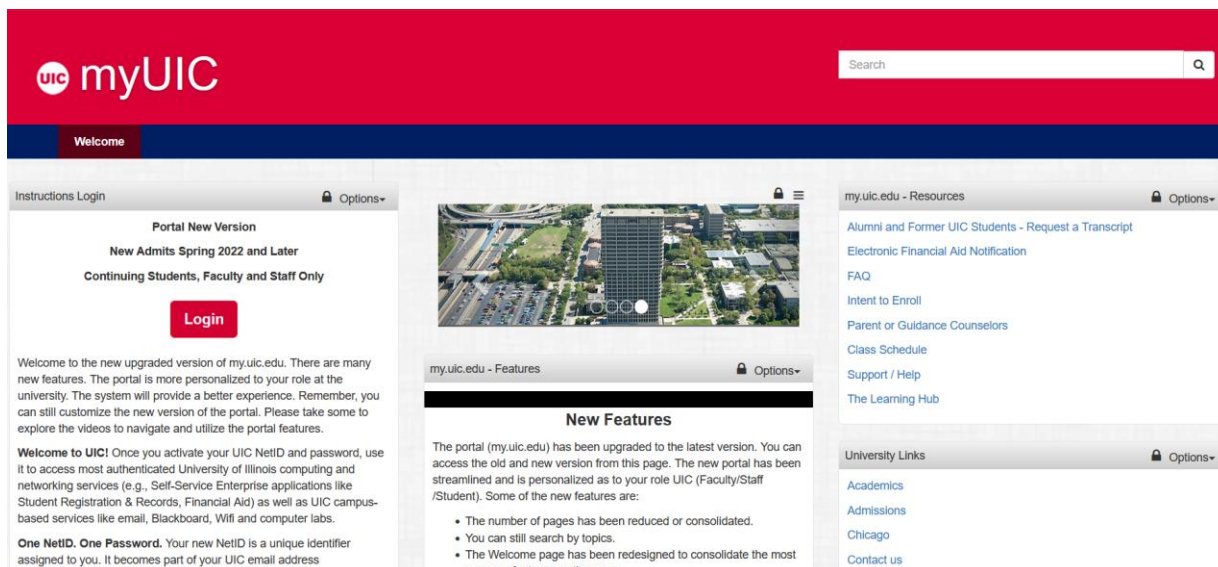
B. Accessing Student Profiles

To access student profiles, you will need a computer with internet access, and any standard browser. If you are off campus, you must use VPN to access the tests. You will need to direct your browser to the following URL:

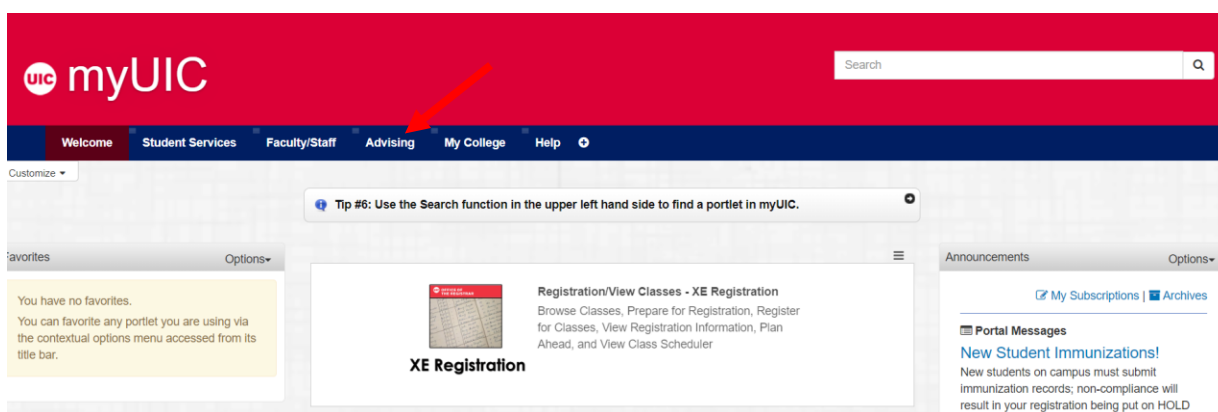

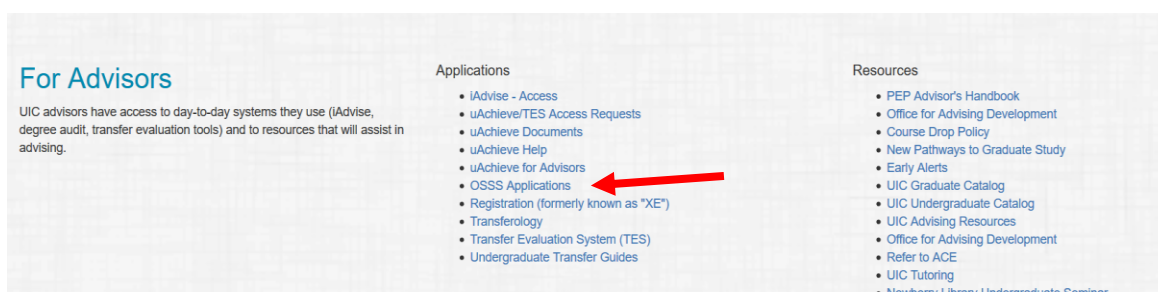





The next section of the profile shows results of placement tests taken during the current enrollment cycle and the corresponding placement recommendations.

The scores for each of the assessment areas are presented in a standardized score format, where there is a range of standardized score values depending on the specific placement test. Score values may range from 0 – 900. A value of “NA” in a score field indicates that a test was not taken. A test score of 950 is used as a placeholder until the final placement is determined. This score is used for Writing, Chinese, Japanese, Polish and Spanish exams.

The Foreign Language section of the profile shows all Foreign Language placement tests taken by the student during the current testing cycle, the scores for each test, and the resulting placement. Because students are permitted to take placement tests in multiple languages, and because these tests are often taken on different testing dates, the testing date for each test is shown on a separate line. The example below is only one example for Arabic. Students can be

tested in any of the ten languages offered by OTS and other languages offered by New York University with permission from the departments.

IV. Interpreting and Using the Educational Performance Profile (EPP)

One of the major goals of the Educational Performance Profile (EPP) is to present the student's abilities in each assessment area in a manner that will allow the Advisor to understand the student's relative strengths and weaknesses. The Office of Testing Services selected the method of standardizing the results on all PEP tests to assist in this procedure. The use of standardized test scores provides a common yardstick and allows you, the College Advisor, to gauge the ability level of each student compared to other UIC students.

A. Academic Writing

New students are not required to take the Academic Writing placement test if UIC has an official score for one of the following:

- ACT English score of 27 or higher; OR
- SAT Evidence-Based Reading + Writing score of 630 or higher; OR
- AP English Language & Composition with a score of 3-5; OR
- IB English Language A: Language and Literature Higher or Standard Level with a score of 6-7

Note: If the scores have been submitted and the student has submitted their Intent to Enroll an exemption will be automatically placed. The student will not have to take the test.

New Process Starting 2024 Testing Cycle: A workaround was in place for students who took UIC Dual Credit for English 160 or have college credit for English 160 or 161 or didn't submit test scores. This resulted in the 30 placement "Essay being Evaluated". The department would be contacted about why the test wasn't graded. A new process will eliminate the back and forth about exemptions, college credit, etc. between colleges, placement testing office, office of admissions and OSSS.

A preliminary set of questions was added to the English placement test. Based on the answers a new placement code of 07 was created and the student does not have to take the placement test. The students are asked three questions about test scores and coursework. They are Yes/No answers. Based on their answers they are instructed to submit the necessary information (official test scores or transcripts) to UIC.

New Students Spring 2026, Summer 2026 and Fall 2026: Students who need to take the English Placement Test but had a placement code of 07 need to retake the English Preliminary Question Quiz. To access the testing system again, new students need to go to the testing page in UIC Connect and click on **"Go to the On-Line Placement Tests (all tests excluding Math)"**. Continuing students must go to the student tab and select Continuing Students Placement Test Requests and click on **"On-line Placement Test (Non-Math)"** button. They need to select the "English Preliminary Questions" and click on Re-attempt Quiz and answer the questions. Once they submit the quiz, they will be able to take the English test.

Academic Writing Tests taken prior to 9/9/25: Students who need to take the English Placement Test but had a placement code of 07 need to request the test. Students will need to state they need to take the test because their credits/scores don't count for ENGL 160. They do this by logging into the portal and clicking on the student tab. Click on the Placement Test dropdown and select Continuing Students Placement Test Requests.

The placement for Yes answers will allow a student to register for an orientation and advising session. Students who ask about test scores and college credit should be instructed to go to the test and answer the preliminary questions. They should follow the instructions. If a student has submitted transcripts and test scores and it is not reflected in the student system, they should contact the admissions office.

Note: The list provided in question three was reviewed by TADA. The list is active Illinois Colleges/Universities and the current English courses that will transfer as either English 160 or 161.

Transfer students who have completed at least one semester of college-level Academic Writing/English Composition are exempt from the Academic Writing placement test

Any student who is exempt from the Academic Writing placement test because of test scores will be awarded three (3) hours of credit for English 160 and may enroll in English 161.

All students who take the Academic Writing placement test complete a writing sample.

A new placement code has been implemented for the 2023 cycle. The 01 Banner Placement code will be used when an essay cannot be evaluated. The wording a student or advisor will see is:

“Essay cannot be scored. Please read your UIC email for reason and next steps OR email CompTalk@uic.edu to ask for next steps.”

The student needs to read their email or contact the department using the email mentioned above.

Students are placed into an UIC writing course based on an evaluation of their writing sample by the English Department. Placements based on essay evaluations may include:

B. Chemistry

Placement in General Chemistry courses is based upon the results of the Chemistry test. There are two types of questions on the Chemistry test; *Quantitative Knowledge* and *Chemical Concepts*. The Chemistry test produces separate scores in these two areas.

Students who have not taken general chemistry before attending UIC must take the Chemistry placement test before taking a course in General Chemistry at UIC. Students with a "C" or better in a general chemistry course may use that as a prerequisite for enrolling in the next General

Chemistry course at UIC, but they are advised to take the placement test to ascertain if their current knowledge is sufficient for success.

The UIC Department of Chemistry enforces computer-generated course placements for students enrolling in General Chemistry courses. It is recommended that you do not advise a student to take a course different from the one indicated on the Educational Performance Profile unless you have received permission from the Chemistry Department.

If the Chemistry Placement is “Postpone Chemistry,” the student must follow the recommendation described in the table, i.e., Postpone chemistry until passing **MATH 110** (or transfer equivalent) with a grade of C or better, then contact chemistry for an override into CHEM 101. If MATH placement is MATH 121 or higher, or equivalent transfer credit in Math 110 or higher-level math course has been completed with a grade of C or better, contact chemistry for an override into CHEM 101. C. Foreign Languages

In some instances, students with no prior knowledge of the language they choose to study at UIC are not required to take a placement test. Except for students wishing to study Spanish who must take the placement exam, students with earned credit (via completed coursework completed outside of UIC or awarded test-based credit) are permitted to register for the next course in a sequence but are encouraged to complete the appropriate placement test(s) in order to confirm the most appropriate registration.

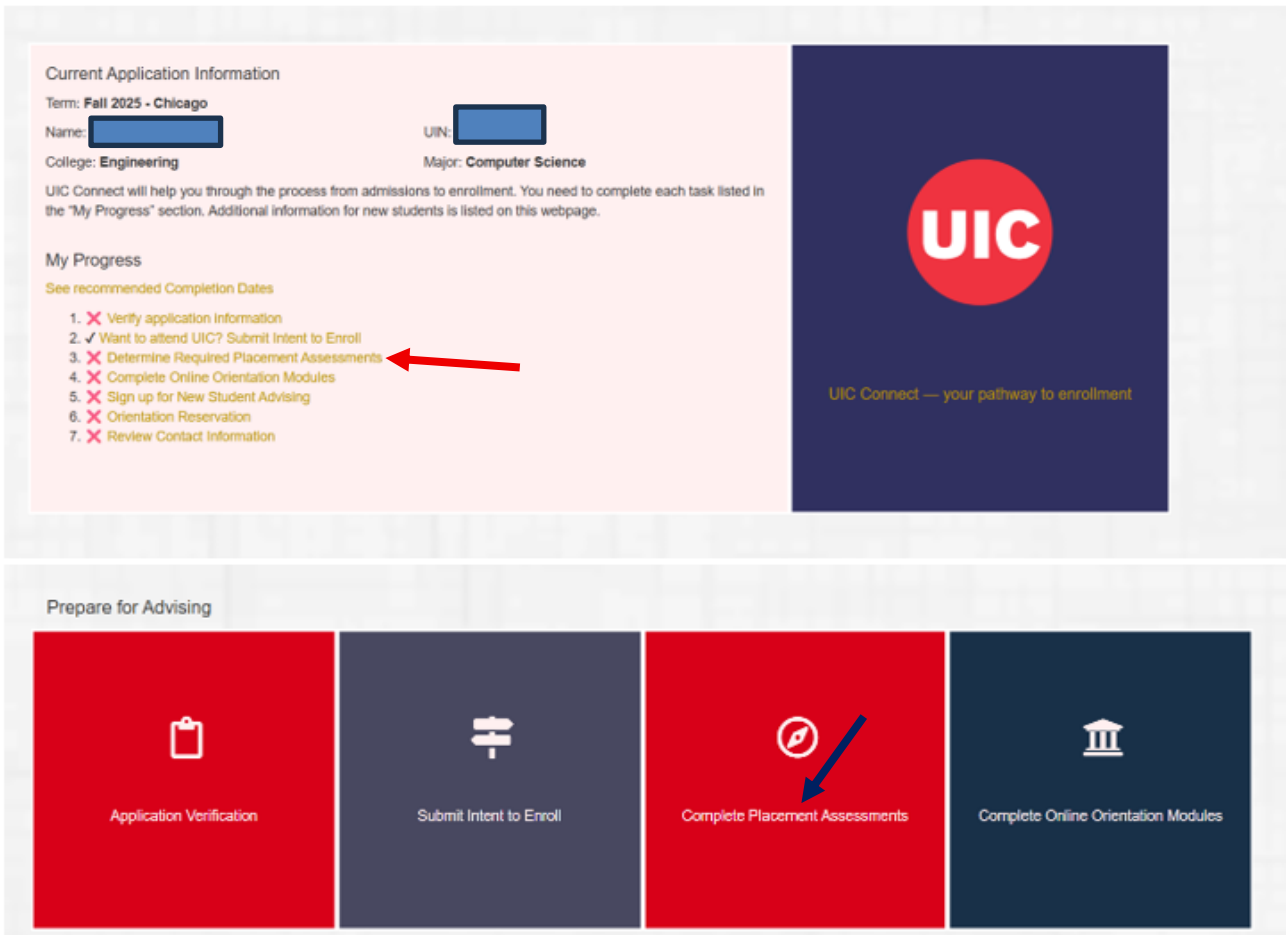

VI. Student Process for Accessing Placement Tests

A. New Students:

New students access the placement tests by logging into the portal and going to the UIC Connect tab. All the placement information will be displayed to new students through links on the UC Connect pages. The steps are:

1. Log into the portal and go to the UIC Connect tab.



2. Click on the “Determine Required Placement Assessments Link in the checklist or “Complete Placement Assessments” in the Prepare for Advising row.
3. Different text is displayed depending upon whether a student needs to answer questions.
 - a. First Year Students who are not required to answer any questions. They are in the College of Engineering, Business, Education, Applied Health Sciences, and Nursing. In the other colleges, there are certain majors that have questions but not the entire college.

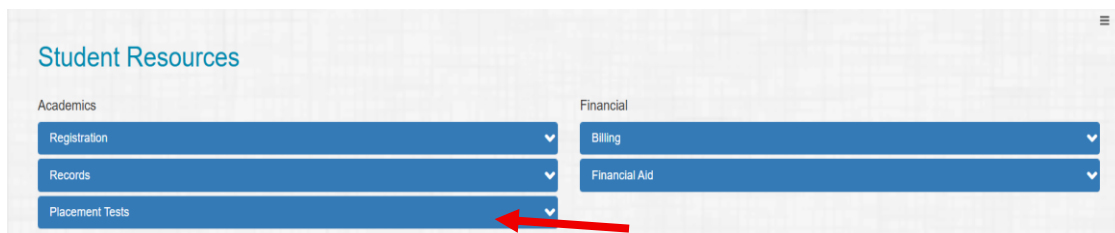

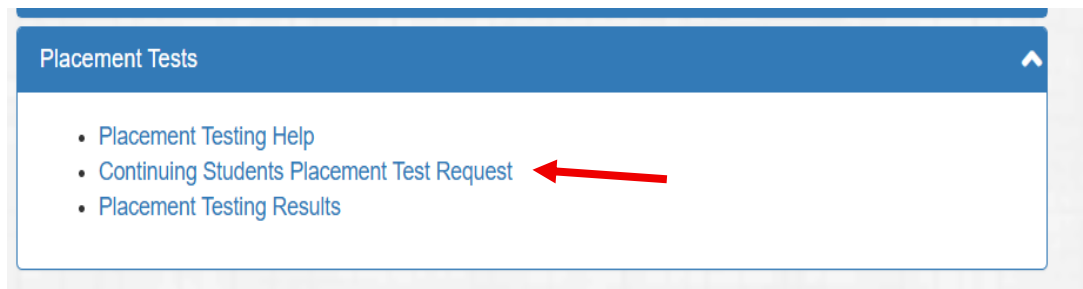
B. Continuing Students:

The placement testing system lists all the tests except math that a student must take or has been approved.

UIC Placement Tests

You need to complete all of your placement tests at least two weeks before registering for classes. Spring 2026 incoming students need to complete their test(s) prior to signing up for Orientation and Advising Sessions. Orientation and Advising sign-up will be available in November on the my.UIC.edu portal.

Important: Please read the instructions below. At the end of the instructions are the links to the placement tests. The math placement test is in another system. You will need to click on "Go to the Math Placement Test (ALEKS)" provided on the previous placement testing webpage.

- Once you start a test, you cannot stop the clock or access the test from another computer.
- You may take the tests in whatever order you want.
- You do not have to take your online placement tests all at once. You may log out after the first test and reconnect through the links in UIC Connect (new student) or Placement Tests - Continuing student in the portal.
- You may take a test only once.
- Incoming First Year Students are required to complete English, Math and Chemistry (if required) tests prior to signing up for Orientation. Submitting a test will meet this requirement. It may take up to three days before you can register for Orientation after submitting your last test.

Before starting your placement tests, make sure to:

- Review the content and timings on the placement [testing website](#).
- Have a reliable internet connection.
- Choose a quiet location where you will be able to work on a computer UNINTERRUPTED for an hour or two.
- Close all other applications before you begin taking a placement test so that you can focus on its questions and complete it within the time limit.
- Have a pencil and scratch paper ready for calculations and diagrams if you want to take the Chemistry placement exam.
- If you have any questions related to placement testing or experience a problem while taking an exam, contact us by submitting a [UIC Placement Testing Help](#) ticket.
- Note:** Links to the Tests are at the bottom of this page. The math placement test is in another system. You will need to use the link provided on the previous placement testing webpage.

Cheating

All members of the UIC community are expected to demonstrate academic integrity. Test Results

- Continuing Students:** On the Student tab at the bottom of the page, select the Placement Testing Results portlet.
- New Incoming Students:** in the Placement Testing Portlet in UIC Connect.

Test results will be available according to this schedule:

- Arabic, Chemistry, Physics, French, German, Italian, and Latin:** 1-3 days after test submission.
- Chinese, Computer Science, Japanese, Korean, Polish, and Russian:** Within 14 business days of test submission. During the first two weeks of the term, test results can be available sooner. However, it will be at least 3 days after test submission.
- English:** Your test results will be available within 14 business days after test submission. During the first two weeks of the term, test results can be available sooner. However, it will be at least 3 days after test submission.

New Incoming Spring Students: Placement tests for students entering in Spring are not reviewed until late November. The department reviews the tests by the date submitted. It usually takes 3-4 weeks to clear the backlog. After the backlog is cleared, the tests are graded once a week. There will be an initial placement of "Essay being reviewed" which will allow you to sign up for Orientation and Advising Sessions.

Tests Requiring an Essay Evaluation: Within 14 business days of test submission. During the first two weeks of the term, test results can be available sooner. However, it will be at least 3 days after test submission.

Spring 2026 Deadline Dates for Completing Tests: New Students need to complete their test(s), the Online Orientation module, Orientation, and Advising. Orientation and Advising sign-up to begin in November 2025. Continuing students need to complete the test(s) prior to registering for classes. Placement tests can be taken until 3:00 pm Sunday, January 25, 2026. However, in order to register for a class requiring a placement test by the add/drop deadline date (January 23, 2026), you must complete the test(s) prior to the final deadline date that is listed below:

- Chemistry, Physics, French, German, Italian, and Latin** - 3:00 PM Wednesday, January 21, 2026
- Arabic, Chinese, Computer Science, English, Korean, Japanese, Polish, Russian and Spanish** - 3:00 PM Sunday, January 18, 2026

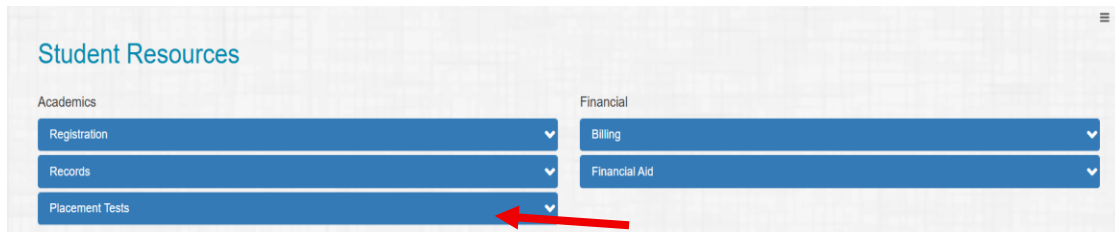

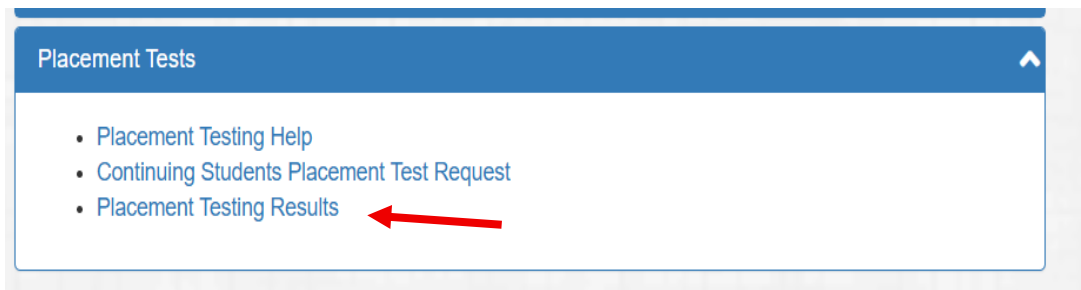

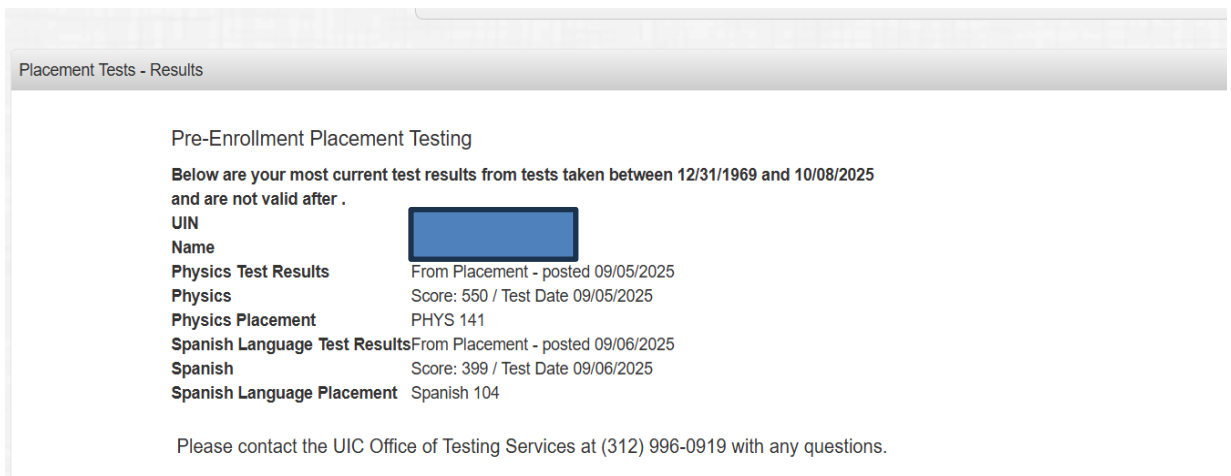
